STORING YOUR BABY FOR THE WINTER By Jim Sangiorgio, Sales and Leasing Specialist, Knopf Automotive, Allentown, PA

While we've had some unusually warm weather so far, Winter is on the way. You know what that means? It's time to store our babies and protect them from the elements. Follow these simple tips to ensure that your Mercedes-Benz will be ready to drive come Spring.

Tip #1: Change the oil. It's very important to give your car a fresh oil change. Don't think just because you might have changed it last spring that it's OK. It's not. If there's any dirt

in the oil, it will settle into your oil pan. Over time, this can cause sludge build up which can clog the breather on your oil pump. It's a very inexpensive way to ensure your engine is protected.

Tip #2: Inflate those tires. Check your tires and inflate to your manufacturers specifications. In fact, it's an even better idea to over inflate. This may help with flat spots from sitting. You may notice flat spots when you first start driving again, but these should disappear after 10 miles or so of driving. Also, if your tires are over three years old, think about replacing them in the Spring. Experts believe that some of the materials in the tires lose their elasticity and may dry rot from within where you can't see it.

Tip #3: Tank up. Fill your tank with fresh fuel. It's hard to get fuel without some percentage of ethanol in it. Experts state this trace amount of alcohol settles in the bottom of the tank. Upon initial startup, you could be getting pure alcohol running through your fuel lines which could damage some rubber components. It's also a great idea to put a fuel stabilizer in your tank if your car is going to sit more than 30 days.

Tip #4: Check for leaks. Putting some plastic sheeting under your car is a great way to discover if you have anything leaking. Over time seals dry out without you being aware of it. But catching these fluids you might be able to discover where it might be coming from. You can address this when you're ready to drive your car again in the Spring. Also, you can put some plastic wrap under your wiper blades to keep them from dry rotting and sticking to your windshield.

Tip #5: Wax your baby. A fresh coat of wax is sure to keep the oils in the paint and allow you to put an indoor car cover on your car's finish. Waxing your car can also help prevent scratches, because when you put a car cover on a dirty, unwaxed car, it can scratch the paint. The car cover may help keep the vermin hiding in your garage from getting inside and damaging your interior. And don't forget to crack the windows to let moisture accumulation out. It's also a good idea to pull out carpet mats which do tend to build up moisture as well.

Tip #6: Attach a battery charger. Tender your battery with the latest trickle charger. Over time batteries lose their charge. Nothing is more frustrating than going out to start your car only to leave you stranded because your battery has lost its charge. Trickle chargers are not only are a great way to extend the life of your battery, but they also make a great Christmas gift...hint, hint. When set up properly, they simply replenish the charge lost by your car just sitting.
