The Bridgewater Manor is conveniently located near major roadways and is easy to get to from your location. As time gets closer, we will let you know more details.

Per the 2022 event (subject to change for 2023) the cars will be broken down into two categories -- Concours (judged by a team of judges according to MBCA guidelines) and Popular (voted on by those in attendance). The cars in Concours class are then further broken down according to chassis. Concours cars need to be detailed and will be judged in four categories: 1 -- Interior, Upholstery, Trunk; 2 -- Glass, Lights, Rubber, Chrome, Trim; 3 -- Engine Compartment; 4 -- Paint, coachwork; and points are also given for mileage and age. There is a mandatory 2-point deduction if your car is trailered to the event. Popular Vote cars are divided into two categories (Sedan and Sport) and then further broken down by years -- New -- 2016 to present; Modern -- 2005 -- 2015; Old -- 1996 -- 2005; Vintage -- pre - 1996. My advice for the Popular Vote cars is to "Give the baby a bath and come enjoy a good time with fellow Benz enthusiasts." Cars over 25 years old are also eligible for the Silver Star Preservation certificate -- you can be in either Popular or Concours and have our car judged for this certificate. Registration information will be available soon.

Mercedes Benz Technology Transition: Short History of Electronic Engine Control

A few months ago, I found out that some service centers were going to limit the age of the Mercedes Benz cars that they would work on to 1990's and newer. I wasn't given an exact cutoff date or chassis/model that was being considered. However, it appeared that they were referring to cars that incorporated electronic engine control units (ECU) that could be monitored through the onboard diagnostic port (OBD) port.

There are two generations of the OBD port: the OBD-I port, and OBD-II port. If a car was built after 1996, it probably has an OBD-II port.

OBD-I Port (1981-1986)

Before the release of OBD-I, each car manufacturer set its own OBD standards. For this reason, mechanics had to use a different scan tool to work with each manufacturer, which could get pricey. In 1981, OBD-I was introduced as a way of standardizing onboard diagnostics. The origins of OBD1 in the US can be traced back to California at the end of the 1980s, as it was developed to monitor and control the levels of emissions from automobiles that were a major contributor towards pollution, particularly in car-heavy cities such as Los Angeles and San Francisco. Stricter emissions limits were introduced as well as the requirement for vehicles to self-monitor their emission control systems. Other US states adopted these regulations in the mid-1990s.

OBD-II Port (1994-Present)

To improve upon what was already established, OBD-II was created. This advanced port was released in 1994 with better diagnostic ability. The under the hood computerization began about 1996 for the W140. Since 1996, All Mercedes

Benz vehicles in the USA have been equipped with OBD-II. In the EU, it became mandatory for petrol (gasoline) vehicles to be equipped with OBD-II since 2001, and diesel vehicles from 2004.

Electronic Ignition and Fuel Injection System

Bosch perfected their Jetronic (Bosch Jetronic — The Dawn of Electronic Fuel Injection) electronic fuel injection system, which used data from a pressure sensor as well as engine speed to control the fuel injection rate. Jetronic was indeed a computer-based system, and it worked. Bosch licensed it to several automakers; the first to put it into production was Volkswagen in 1968 Type III Fastback and Squareback.

There have also been microprocessors in Mercedes cars from way back in the late 60's and early 70's when Robert Bosch was developing the Jetronic for the S-Class M110. No microprocessors, all analog, with a few integrated circuits (IC's).

Mercedes Benz Transition to the Bosch KE-Jetronic System

In September 1985, the factory introduced two completely new six-cylinder SOHC engines, M103 (already used in the W124 series), replaced the 2.8-litre DOHC M110 engines. The carbureted version was replaced by a 2.6-litre fuel injection engine, while the 3.0-litre version replaced the fuel injected M110. Also new was a 4.2-litre V8 engine, designed to replace the 3.8-liter version used in the W126 sedans, coupés, and the SL-Class. The 5.0-litre engine was modified to receive electronic ignition and electronic-mechanical fuel injection in the form of the Bosch KE-Jetronic system. Performance was increased to 245 hp (183 kW). An ECE version of the 5.0litre M117 V8 engine was also available from September 1987 with a power output of 265hp (198kW). (Mercedes-Benz 126 specifications (mercedesautoworks.com))

Conclusion

The emergence of the OBD port in the early 1980s coincided with the adoption of electronic ignition and fuel injection systems. The development of electronically controlled engines required more sophisticated onboard monitoring and diagnostic system for tuning and troubleshooting. This can be seen by reviewing in detail the development of the Bosch KE-Jetronic for the Mercedes Benz. However, after a quick review of the development of the Bosch system, I'll save that article for another day. To answer the question raised at the beginning of this article, it appears that the cutoff date for working on earlier Mercedes Benz would be 1996 which are cars that have the OBD2 port. This provides the best diagnostics and most cost-effective service for older cars.

Airbag Recall

At Mercedes-Benz, our highest priority is keeping you safe. So we'd like to share some important information about a recall involving Takata frontal airbags used in many vehicles, including certain Mercedes-Benz models. This safety recall is a result of inflators that may improperly deploy with excessive force in the event of a crash. Takata and other inflator suppliers are working with the U.S. Department of Transportation National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to coordinate availability of replacement airbags as soon as possible. 


